#### A multidimensional study of poverty and health capability in rural Senegal [[Latest version](#)]

**Abstract:** Addressing the multidimensionality of poverty is a major challenge in resource-limited settings where programs for health promotion often homogeneously target poor households. Following the collection of survey data in rural Senegal, I develop a structural equation model (SEM) to estimate and characterize three dimensions of health capability as conceptualized by Prah: self-reported health, empowerment, and healthcare access. In accounting for the multidimensionality of both poverty and health capability at the individual level, I highlight complex and sometimes contradictory effects. In particular, I provide novel evidence that empowerment, a key component of health capability, is lower in individuals living in resource-rich households, even though these individuals are more likely to report optimal levels in health and access to healthcare. My estimates emphasize a need to design differentiated policy and interventions for overall poverty reduction and health promotion. They also show how to do so through a comprehensive characterization of the socio-demographic and economic variables associated with distinct dimensions of health capability.
